Hospital and Outreach Education: Management Committee

Unlike a school who have a Governing Body who are responsible for the running of the school, a pupil referral unit like HOE has a 'Management Committee'. They function exactly like a Governing Body, and meet 3 times a year to challenge and steer the provision. There are also an additional 3 meetings a year for sub committees for finance and resources, and learning and curriculum. We have a new member of the committee, Lisa McGarrity. Lisa is a member of the Independent Advice and Support Service and used to be a teacher. Her skills and experience will be of a huge help to us moving forward. Lisa will be taking over as the chairperson of the sub committee for Learning and Curriculum.

Outcomes from last year's pupils

We like to let you know how the pupils we supported last year got on in their external examinations. In the last academic year, we supported 32 pupils who were taking GCSE exams and the pupils had been with us for varying lengths of time: all pupils got at least one external qualification. 57% of the cohort got at least 5 GCSEs A* - G, all included Maths & English (increase of 9% from last year) and 25% of pupils gained 5 or more GCSEs A* - C (increase of 4%) and 22% of those included Maths & English (increase of 4%).

73% of pupils returned to school successfully. 90% of our leavers are in employment, further education or training (decrease of 4%).

We are very proud of all of our pupils, regardless of their external examination results. Many of them have overcome really significant barriers to even be able to attend their lessons let alone take their exams!

Some of the ex-students are coming back to talk to our current cohort so they can ask them questions and find out what helped them, and what it is really like to attend college, 6th form or undertake an apprenticeship.

Values Based Education

This year, we are running a 'Values Based' curriculum. Each month we have a 'value of the month' and all teachers use opportunities within their subjects to talk about the value, what it means and how we might demonstrate it. All the values which we are looking at were decided on in consultation with the staff and our pupils from last year. Curriculum information for pupils at bases

Maths

All students have been working their way through the topics in number and embedding their basic skills in order to have a secure foundation to move forward. Some are preparing for a test on number and will be taking their functional skills level 1 paper. The next topic will be Statistics.

English

We have now finished our study on Animal Farm and this term we are getting in the festive spirit as we are studying A Christmas Carol in preparation for our GCSE! We are tracking Scrooge's transformation and exploring the historical context of the novella.

Science

All base students (with the exception of the Bridge) have completed the Biology unit of work as part of their Science GCSE. Students are now working on their ISA coursework which contributes 25% to their GCSE grade. Students have worked hard on their work and should be proud of the effort that they have been contributing!

IT

In ICT, the students have been learning how to stay safe online. They have investigated using secure passwords, how to use social media safely, cyberbullying and its impact and one of the biggest current issues as widely reported in our National media: Sexting. ***I will be holding a Parent Time session in each of our bases in February 2017 on these topics and more. Invitations will be issued nearer the time via our family liaison workers.***

The students have also been learning about email etiquette and how to search the internet effectively. I have introduced the students to GCSE Pod which is an award winning platform for revision using audio podcasts. The students were all very receptive to the wonderful resources provided and I would kindly ask Parents/Guardians to encourage them to use it regularly for all their GCSE subjects.

Next we are taking a closer look at what goes in inside a computer. The students will learn about the component parts and peripherals to gain a better understanding of what technology does and how rapidly it is developing. They will investigate emerging trends in technology such as robotics and wearable devices.

Preparation for Working Life

In P4WL the students have been studying about applying for jobs and courses. They have compiled a basic CV, filled in application forms and written covering letters. The students enjoyed learning about body language and non-verbal communication.

Soon the students will have a mock interview based on a job they have researched in Careers lessons. This experience teaches them relevant and necessary skills for life.

Our next topic is all about staying safe both personally and in the world of work. We will be visiting the National Safety Centre in Milton Keynes in the New Year. Dates are yet to be confirmed. Watch this space for more information!

Careers

Students have explored the www.careercompanion.co.uk website and have spent time exploring and researching career options. They have begun producing reports on possible career choices. This term students will select a work experience placement of their choice for work experience week beginning 6th February 2017. Tours to the local colleges will be arranged to take place early December or during January 2017 (Northampton College, Booth Lane, Moulton College and Tresham Kettering).

Food Technology.

Last term, students cooked soup, muffins, pizza, cheesy scones and spaghetti bolognese. This term students will cook flapjacks, stuffed baked potatoes, cheese and onion straws and frangipane mince pies.

Personal, Social and Health Education

Our topic this term is Drugs Education. We have been researching the Government's Guidelines on alcohol limits and we have been exploring how many units are in different types of alcoholic drinks. We will be trying to navigate a remote control car around an obstacle course whilst wearing 'beer goggles' to appreciate the effect of alcohol on visual-spatial awareness!

Religious Education

In RE, have just completed a unit on Religious attitudes to Crime and Punishment, and will be looking next at Rich and Poor in British Society.

Art and Design

Students are busy preparing their coursework for the exams, researching different artists and undertaking a piece of art work in the style of that artist. There are already some amazing pieces which is very exciting! After Christmas we will be starting to prepare for the exam pieces as art exams take place early, around the middle of April.



Digital Resilience

We are all aware that no matter how much we read or try to keep up, our young people are always one step ahead of us when it come to their knowledge of the Internet and the latest social networking sites and apps. It is worth getting your child to do the 'Buzz personality test' you can find in the year 7 area (if they haven't already) – it gives some direction to where your child might want to start looking.

New GCSEs unravelled

Which subjects are affected?

Due to the number of different GCSEs that are being updated, not all subjects will be moving to the new 1-9 system at the same time. It is quite possible that your child will have a mix of letter and number grades when they receive their targets this year. This is the same nationally and your child will not be disadvantaged in any way by this. In 2017, the numerical grades will be given for Maths, English Language, and English Literature.

What is considered a 'good' pass?

To align the UK with the best education systems in the world the government has raised expectations of achievement and will now consider a 'good pass' at GCSE to be a grade 5. You will see from the OFQUAL leaflet included that this inevitably means a smaller percentage of students are expected to gain this standard than gained a C grade in the past.
